Expanding beyond Ukraine, we assess how the conflict reshapes geopolitical interests in the High North, where security concerns intersect with strategic resource competition. Finally, we delve into the weaponisation of artificial intelligence within the war, addressing its immediate battlefield applications and the ethical dilemmas posed by autonomous systems in combat. Together, these papers provide a comprehensive perspective on how the Ukraine war redefines warfare and regional stability.
